B). Brief descriptions of the Project Proposals & estimates for proposals:

1. We will continue the mission of the Wimalawansa Education Trust Funds with giving scholarships to needy children (Goal, Rs: 1,000,000).
Donation require = \$100 (USD) per student, per year.
2. Research and development of a new highly cost-effective water purification method: estimate Rs. 450,000, onetime cost (US \$40,000)—research is currently conducted at the laboratories of Dr. Wimalawansa
3. Provision of safe and clean drinking water to needy villages (Estimate US: \$1,000,000 – grant applied for the Gates Foundation, USA) (Equivalent of Rs. 130,000,000). These funds to be used to implementation of region-wide education and awareness program, and provision of safe drinking water system and to test it efficacy in the reduction of morbidity and mortality in the entire North Central Province (NCP), over a two-year period to obtain. This would allow obtaining statistical validation of the outcome of the introduction of clean and safe drinking water to people.
4. Provision of school supplies to schools and individual students in schools located in remote areas (Estimate Rs: 400,000 per year)
5. Establishment of self-sustaining Montessori programs in remote villagers (Estimate Rs: 750,000)
6. Rural Women’s Empowerment program (Estimate Rs: 1,000,000 per year)
7. Establishment and maintenance of distance learning for advance level (high-school students) using Internet-based teaching; English, science, mathematics, leadership, and computer sciences (Estimate Rs: 200,000 per year)
8. Establishment of village level self-sustaining economic assistance and job-creation programs (Estimate Rs: 500,000 per year)

9. Creation of cottage industries and new jobs (Estimate Rs: 500,000 per year)
10. Village up-lifting, social and economic development (Estimate Rs: 500,000 per year)
11. Research and development, and the provision of alternative energy systems (Estimate Rs: 350,000).
12. Working with other NGOs with similar mission to strength and leverage assistance and development programs
13. Provision of basic medical facilities to villages and remote medical centers (Estimate Rs: 200,000 per year)
14. Emphasis on immunization and preventative medicine (no estimate at this time)
